First, students were introduced to the graphic organizer and created a problem and solution essay as a whole class. Then students used the graphic organizer to create their own problem and solution essay related to a curricular novel. Finally, students used the graphic organizer to write a problem and solution essay on a topic of their choice. Data sets include students' essays before and after having used the graphic organizer. Organization was measured by a rubric score and the "overall cohesiveness" of the essay. An essay was scored as "Cohesive" if it had one main idea, stuck to that main idea throughout the essay, and if information was presented in a logical order. Also, attitudinal data includes teacher

notes from a class discussion about writing before and after the intervention. Results: Overall, students' essay organization improved. About 79% of the post-intervention writing samples were scored as "Cohesive," and received higher rubric scores than the pre-intervention writing samples.
